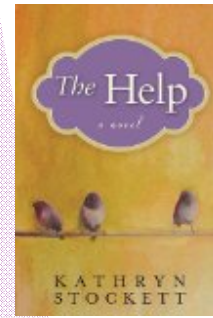

Most notably he is a member of the Pennsylvania Past Players, a group of highly-trained living history interpreters bringing to life the era of the Underground Railroad with its manners, culture and impact using "animated democracy" and "Live and Learn" strategies.
